The petitioners seek anticipatory bail in connection with New Town Police Station Case No. 271 of 2018 dated 02.07.2018 for alleged offence punishable under Sections 418/420/406/120B of the Indian Penal Code.

The petitioners are the C.E.O. and C.F.O., respectively, of DLF Limited. According to the petitioners, they have been needlessly harassed despite a sum of Rs.5 crore having been deposited by

DLF Limited with the Registrar General in terms of an order dated August 14, 2018.

Whether or not because there is a scent of money, the action of the police personnel does not appear to be above board.

Accordingly, in the event of arrest, the petitioners will be granted bail upon furnishing a security of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) each, with two sureties of Rs.5,000/- (Rupees five thousand only) each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions as laid down in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973. In addition, the petitioners will also report to the Investigating Officer at such time and place as may be specified by the concerned police officer.

The petition for anticipatory bail is allowed subject to the conditions as indicated above.

A certified copy of this order be immediately made available to the petitioners subject to compliance with all requisite formalities.
