Buoyed by the success of "End Polio", a programme of Rotary International, the efforts of which resulted in eradication of polio from nearly 995 of the world, Rotary wants to start a war against illiteracy in South Asia and provide "Freedom from illiteracy" by the year 2017. WE wish to achieve this with "Rotary's TEACH Mission".

The components are :

### **Teacher Support**

- Periodical evaluation & appraisal of teachers
  - District / National level recognitions
  - ✓ Standardised evaluation method
  - ✓ To include cash prize
  - ✓ Recognised on our websites
  - Trained volunteers as teachers
    - ✓ Training module to be available online
    - ✓ Volunteers to be tested before being deputed
    - ✓ Special emphasis on youth/senior citizens/spouses of Rotarians
    - ✓ Provision of contractual employment of volunteers
    - ✓ Continuous teacher training through E-learning modules.

#### E-learning

- Establishment of E-learning Centres in schools
- Provision of E-learning kits in needy schools.
- Development of software for each state curriculum in local language and English to be Govt's responsibility with Rotary's advocacy.
- Other costs like projector/ power back-up etc to be approx Rs 30,000/to be shared equally between National Committee, Club and school.

#### Adult Literacy

- Use of 'E-learning' module (presently available in 9 languages)
- Promotion of formation of 'Self Education Groups'
- Active participation of Rotarians, their spouses, Rotaractors and Interactors as volunteers
- Use social media as a tool
- Specialised training to housewives and girls living in slums.
- Promotion of literacy among mothers

- Functional literacy through
  - ✓ Vocational training
  - $\checkmark$  Basic education in maths, business fundamentals, computer skills etc
  - ✓ Promote 'Learning for Earning'
- Working persons can benefit by Accelerated Learning modules.

### **Child Development**

- Special emphasis on overall inclusive growth
- Eradication of child labour
- Bringing the school dropouts back to school
- Equity in education for Differently abled children
- Provision of scholarship to meritorious students.

### Happy Schools

- Clean schools Painted and well-mainained school buildings
- Benches and desks for better student-teacher interaction
- Clean and hygienic toilets for boys and girls
- Clean and pure drinking water for both children and teachers
- Library for schools having children exceeding the count of 200
- Provision of uniform and footwear for every child
- Well-maintained space for teaching staff.

Clubs are requested to identify schools which lack at least 4 of the above requisites and provide them to make them 'Happy Schools'

## Bridge the education gap : take action during Rotary Literacy Month by Ellina Kushnir, RI Programs

Despite rising literacy rates for youth and adults, 897 million people around the world are still illiterate\* and 57 million children of primary school age are not in school. In March, Rotary Literacy Month, let's reaffirm our commitment to meet basic education and literacy needs locally and abroad.

Here are just a few examples of how we're helping improve education around the world :



The Rotary Club of Tachia Centennial, Taiwan helps children foster a love for learning and reading by donating books to children from birth to age five. The Taichung City Education Bureau advises on which books to distribute through the Bookstart project. More than 130 families

have already participated in this program.



✤ Focused on improving reading comprehension and an appreciation for books, the Rotary Club of Nassau Sunrise, Bahamas, launched a reading time initiative at a community preschool. Every week, club members read and mentor students and cultivate the children's appreciation for

books. While global literacy rates are on the rise, there's still much to be done. Looking for projects to support?

✤ The Rotary Club of Phnom Penh, Cambodia, is seeking assistance to support a mobile library in remote regions of the country. The library is operated by a librarian and a volunteer assistant. Each mobile library circulates around ten communities throughout the week. In addition to providing community members access to books, the librarian also leads reading and storytelling



activities. About 1,000 people benefit from this program every month.

The Rotary Club of Grand Cayman-Sunrise, Cayman Islands, is seeking partners to help support a local Leveled Literacy Intervention program. Students

improve reading skills by participating in this program after school four to five days a week for up to 18 weeks.
